MINIBEASTS INCURSION - GRADE 1

On Tuesday the Grade 1's attended a Science 'Mini-Beasts' Incurison. Overall, it was a very good incurison – the facilitator, Liz, brought the scientific process of classifying animals to life in a simple way that the students could understand. To reinforce the classification process, she had plenty of specimens for the children to touch and classify. There were tortoise shells, starfish, various insects in science dishes (including scorpions and ants) as well as other preserved specimens in jars (such as fish, a seahorse and a frog). The students also worked in small teams to make worm farms which we will care for in class. The highlight of the incurison was that the students had the opportunity to hold and touch two live frogs and two pythons, one of which was very long!
